Note Particulars

Corporate information

Arihant Gruhnirman Private Limited is registerd under Companies Act, 1956 as private limited company. The company's registered office is located at 302, Persipolis Building Plot No. 74, Sector 17, Vashi, Navi Mumbai - 400703 and its registered office is situated in the state of Maharashtra, i.e. within the jurisdiction of the Registrar of Companies, Maharashtra, at Mumbai. The operations of the Company span in all aspects of real estate development, from the identification and acquisition of land, planning, execution, construction and marketing of projects.

2 Significant accounting policies

2.1 Basis of accounting and preparation of financial statements

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with Indian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis. GAAP comprise mandatory accounting standards as prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. Accounting policies have been consistently applied except where a newly issued accounting standard is initially adopted or a revision to an existing accounting standard requires a change in the accounting policy hitherto in use.

2.2 Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognised in the periods in which the results are known / materialise.

2.3 Inventories

Incomplete Project/Construction Work-In-Progress

'Cost includes direct expenses, construction cost, rates and taxes, borrowing cost, other direct expenditure, allocated overheads and other incidental expenses except land & development rights which is treated as other assets".

2.4 Cash flow statement

Cash flows are reported using the indirect method as per AS-3, whereby profit / (loss) before extraordinary items and tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of non-cash nature and any deferrals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated based on the available information.

2.5 Revenue recognition

(i) Revenue from Projects

Purusant to issuance of revised Guidance Note on Accounting for Real Estate transactions (Revised 2012), by The Institute of Chartered Accountants Of India (ICAI), the Company revised its Accounting Policy of revenue recognition for all projects commencing on or after April 1, 2012 or project where the revenue is recognised for the first time on or after the above date.

(ii) Other Income

Interest Income is recognized on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the applicable interest rate. Interest income is included under the head other income in the statement of profit and loss.
